Here is the bio for one of our Spring Meeting speakers, Nana Will. Ms. Will was one of the top speakers at ABKA's National Convention in Dallas last year. She will be discussing dog behavior on the morning of May 5th.

Nana Will has been a full-time professional trainer for 16 years. She has extensive experience in training pet dogs, service dogs, shelter dogs, dog trainers and the development of dog training programs. Ms. Will owned and operated a boarding and training facility from 1988-2002. She currently owns and operates Dog's Eye View, which develops training programs for organizations, holds workshops and classes and trains apprentices.

Ms. Will developed and directed the Boulder Valley Humane Society's dog training program for 14 years. In 1996, she developed an enrichment program for shelter dogs. This program focused on teaching the dogs basic manners so that they would be more adoptable.

Ms. Will was the State Trainer for a national service dog organization for nine years. In 1998, she founded Colorado Assistance Dog Education and Training (CADET), a non-profit service dog organization run by volunteers.

Honored with numerous awards and featured in several articles and television presentations, Ms. Will is a charter member of the Association of Pet Dog Trainers and a member of the Association of Behavior Analysis.

Article of Interest - CHF Funded Researchers Closing in on Fanconi Syndrome

The AKC Canine Health Foundation announces that Dr. Gary Johnson's laboratory is closing in on the genetic cause of Fanconi Syndrome (FS) in Basenjis. Canine Fanconi Syndrome is an inherited adult-onset kidney disease, common among the breed. FS, an inherited disease, is a major health concern for Basenjis. With this syndrome, the tubules in the kidney, for unknown reasons, fail to do their job of reabsorbing nutrients into the dog's system.

Reminder for AOL Users

ABKA has been experiencing a number of email delivery issues with members who have America Online (AOL) accounts. It has come to our attention that email sent from the ABKA office destined for AOL accounts is being blocked from delivery after being designated as "Junk Mail." This is happening even if ABKA did not generate the original communication, but is trying to respond to an email sent in from a member with an AOL account.

The explanation offered by AOL is that some of our members with AOL email addresses have, at some point in time, designated incoming ABKA email as "Junk" so the AOL filters then recognize all subsequent ABKA email as "Junk" and block delivery.

ABKA has tried repeatedly to resolve this issue by utilizing AOL technical support, but a satisfactory solution has not been reached. Therefore, we are suggesting that members with AOL accounts consider the following action(s):

- AOL account holders should not identify ABKA emails as "Junk" but rather simply delete the ABKA email when it is no longer needed. (Note: ABKA only uses mail to correspond with members for legitimate associationrelated business.)
- ABKA members currently using AOL may want to consider opening an alternate email account. Many providers, such as Yahoo and Hotmail offer free email services. If you do choose this option, however, please be sure to notify ABKA of your new email address. It is worth mentioning that many free email accounts are very sensitive to storage quotas and it is necessary to clear old emails frequently to make room for incoming mail.

Please keep in mind that these suggested actions are general in nature and if you are uncertain of what to do we strongly suggest you contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP) for specific technical support.

As a general rule, if an ABKA member with an AOL email account has not received a response from the ABKA staff within two business days, the member should assume that the AOL Junk Filter has impacted the delivery and should follow up with ABKA by phone.
